



Dear Elliot,

I want to relay to you the circumstances regarding two activations from your AED Link service at our communications center at Evergreen Fire Rescue.

On March 6, 2016, an alert came through AED Link that there was a potential cardiac arrest call by the customer service desk at our local Safeway grocery store at 3851 Hwy 74. Responders at the nearby Montessori school (which is in our present notification radius) were alerted by AED Link notifying 5 of their staff and two of them responded with their AED to the emergency. As they arrived on scene Jefferson County Sheriff's Office was arriving with their AED. While the Montessori School responders did not actually use their AED, it is clear that had law enforcement been delayed for even a minute, the responders would have been able to jump in, do CPR and apply their AED.

Another incident on July 7, 2016, (this time at a private residence also within the preset response radius for our AED locations), the AED Link successfully notified 6 registered/trained responders at Gysin Insurance of a Cardiac Arrest event. Two of the Gysin Insurance employees responded with their AED, arriving at the same time as our Medic Unit. Had our Medic unit not been near by returning from a previous call there is no doubt the Gysin Insurance AED would have arrived first and been applied to the patient.

We are enthusiastic about our use of AED Link and are comforted to know that we can depend on the responders in your system to safely respond to nearby emergencies.
